Re: “Lil’ Shadd Learns about Ujima” A Special Publication of a Saskatchewan Legacy Children’s Book

Dr. Alfred Schmitz Shadd was a Saskatchewan pioneer medical doctor, teacher, journalist and a farmer. He was also involved in civic and municipal politics, and ran for election in the first Saskatchewan provincial election (1905). **“Lil’Shadd learns about Ujima”** is a children's book (grades 1-4) that will be launched in September 2015, in honour of Dr. Shadd’s life (1870-1915) and contribution. The attached publicity banner provides more information about the book and this legacy project.

To cover the costs for publishing and printing a special edition of this children's book that will be ready for the launch in September, Saskatchewan African Canadian Heritage Museum (SACHM) and collaborators have set up a fundraising campaign to raise \$7000. The campaign is already underway, targeting doctors, teachers, farmers, friends of museums, and others who espouse Dr. Shadd’s values.
